Role description and further details

Job description:

About K+

K+ is a two-year Widening Participation programme run by King's College London. We support year 2 and year 13 students in London and parts of Essex and Kent who have the potential to go to the most selective universities, but need support to get there.

About the Role

Year 13 students on K+ will join us for 3 days of intensive revision in chemistry, mathematics or biology to give them the best chance of achieving top grades in these subjects.

As a K+ Revision Bootcamp Teacher, you'll be responsible for delivering 12 1-hour lessons, spread over three days, for a small group of K+ year 13 students. You'll review the content created by Lead Teachers to shape your own lesson plans.

You'll support students to consolidate learning in their tutoring subject and prepare for their upcoming exams.

Key responsibilities:	 Review the curriculum of content created by the Lead Teacher and shape your own lesson plans Manage the operation and delivery of the lessons with staff support Set clear and challenging targets for each student that build on prior attainment and monitor student progress against targets Mark, grade and give written and verbal feedback as required Assess, record and report on the progress and attainment of students Effectively manage behaviour in accordance with the K+ Code of Conduct and to encourage good practice with regard to punctuality, behaviour, and standards of work To be familiar with the needs of students with SEN and plan appropriately to meet those needs, if needed Liaise with the Senior WP Officer (K+ Y13) before and after tutoring sessions each day Maintain strict confidentiality in relation to the performance of K+ students
